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Director's Notes

Sarah Treem is a television writer, producer and playwright. Treem is the co-creator and showrunner of the Golden Globewinning Showtime drama *The Affair*. Previously, Treem was a co-executive producer on the inaugural season of *House of Cards*. She also wrote on all three seasons of HBO's *In Treatment*. Treem began her career writing for theater. Her plays *When We Were Young and Unafraid, A Feminine Ending, The How and the Why* and *Mirror Mirror* have been produced multiple times over and published by Samuel French and the Dramatists Play Service.

Sarah Treem strategically plunked her characters down into this moment of momentous change. So much revolution was swirling around in the country, yet this remains on the periphery of the play. This story lives in the eye of the storm, a calm refuge with all of that as an influential backdrop. The play is rich with tiny historical illusions, and its examination of different approaches to feminism is nuanced. The play is not so much about ideology as it is about the importance of human connection. Not one character is an easily definable type. Each is a complexly developed figure embodying desires and inhibitions, passionately held beliefs and human contradictions. There are five individuals whose paths cross within the two weeks of this story, and each of them is changed in some way. Some, in tremendous ways.

When this piece premiered in 2014, the playwright couldn't have anticipated all the ups and downs we'd see within the next decade. But even in 2023 the play is also not about loss or regression. It's about optimism. Courage. Future vision. Continuing to work for change even when the political climate is daunting. That might mean doing what you can to make a difference one story at a time. One woman at a time. One person at a time.

ABOUT ERIN MCBRIDE AFRICA

Erin McBride Africa is a stage director and theatre professor, currently acting as Interim Chair of Drama at College of Marin. In her first year at COM she directed *The Stories of Eva Luna* and *Everybody.* She earned her MFA in Directing from UC Irvine and her BA in Theatre Arts from CSUN. A few items she directed in the Los



Angeles area include Veronika Decides to Die, A Piece of My Heart, Dog Sees God, and Coffee Chronicled, a devised play about time. She served 8 years as Associate Artistic Director of the Santa Clarita Shakespeare Festival, where she directed Shakespeare's Much Ado About Nothing, Julius Caesar, A Midsummer Night's Dream (2016), a rock musical adaptation of Twelfth Night (2015), and Cymbeline (2014). Erin has worked with Shakespeare & Company (Lenox, MA), Utah Shakespeare Festival (Cedar City, UT), and South Coast Repertory (Costa Mesa, CA). She is a founding member of the S.O.B. Theatre Company in Los Angeles and is a member of Company of Strangers. Her background includes training in classical text, community-based theatre, Linklater Voice, and Viewpoints Techniques.

The story of *When We Were Young and Unafraid* is set in the spring of 1972. Just a few months prior, Roe V. Wade had been argued before the Supreme Court and the nation awaited its landmark decision on reproductive rights. In the same season, both houses of Congress passed the Equal Rights Amendment and sent it to the individual States for ratification—a ratification which still hasn't happened. Our nation was making strong strides towards progress and equality, while also stumbling, and sometimes regressing. The second wave of feminist activism and a surge of consciousness-raising had grown out of the 1960s Civil Rights movement, Vietnam War protests, and Gay Rights marches happening in cities around the country.
